Leadership Change

LtGen Blackman will step down from his leadership role on December 31. He is retiring after serving nearly eight years as President and CEO. The Board of Directors has selected MajGen James Kessler, USMC, as the new President and CEO. Charlotte Hall Veterans Home, Maryland. Commissioners representing veteran organizations of Maryland were in attendance. Representing the Marine Corps League was Commissioner Stuart Blair, PDC and Bernadine Blair, MCLA DM PP.

* A joint meeting of the Maryland veterans Commission, Charlotte Hall Veterans Home Commission, War Memorial Commission was held in a special session.

- War Memorial Commission overview of Veterans Day Program
- Director Sharron Murphy presented an update on Charlotte Hall Veterans Home

- Secretary George Owings, III presented an overview / update on programs of the MDVA
 - ✓ So far this calendar year, the Trust has assisted 15 veterans with grants totaling just under \$50,000
 - ✓ All of the casinos operating in Maryland are contributing to the Trust Fund
 - ✓ The Trust Review Committee just met last Thursday and there
 are even more grants that will be awarded
 - ✓ For 2018, the Maryland Veterans Cemeteries have provided services for 1,583 veterans and 884 dependents
 - √ 2,647 times a veteran or dependent has been laid to rest this year with dignity in one of the five veterans cemeteries
 - ✓ Also, as many of you belong to Veterans organizations remember that we are always looking for volunteer help with clean-up projects at the Cemeteries and Memorials, as well as help to plan the Memorial Day & Veterans Day ceremonies
 - ✓ As of October 29th, the cost for eligible dependents will increase by \$18 to \$780. That includes opening and closing and liner. There is NO cost for veterans buried in state veterans cemeteries
 - ✓ The numbers from the Service Program are astonishing for 2018 and we still have three months to go: 4,130 claims have been filed on behalf of Maryland Veterans and dependents Public contacts have exceeded 97,000 Over 3,600 of the claims filed received approvals for an overall approval rate of 88%. But we did see a slight dip in September awards as the United States VA closed out the Fiscal Year, and denied some older claims that had been pending
 - ✓ Benefits paid from the VA were \$23,573,604.00 which is both monthly compensation and retroactive benefits combined

The state will be contacted so that you can be replaced and the hours will not be counted.

Doctor Robinson was detailed to Washington until a new management team was appointed and during his absence Doctor Marshall was acting. Help USA is renovating the buildings in Perryville. The state is issuing vouchers and providing funds for this program. The ribbon cutting was done and the Governor was present. Currently, there are a number of families with children in the buildings. Members were told that they could make a donation to Help USA Village. Bids for the new replacement home at Perryville were over budget; the designs were modified and submitted for re-bid. We were informed that this is not public housing and the veteran must be enrolled with the VA and must meet the eligibility requirements. These buildings are a community living facility which will look like a house. The Green Street lobby is being remodeled to have bullet proof glass and metal detectors. Most areas will be enclosed for more protection.


